

How To Measure

Accurate measurements are the foundation of a perfectly fitted couture piece. Ask a friend to measure you where possible, wear the undergarments and shoe height intended for the finished dress, and stand relaxed with your arms down. Keep the tape snug against the body but never tight.

Before you begin

- Use a soft fabric measuring tape (not a metal builder's tape).
- Record every figure in centimetres.
- Measure twice — if figures differ, take the larger.
- Do not add ease; our atelier adds the correct allowance.
- Note the heel height you plan to wear.

The measurements

Bust	Around the fullest part of the bust, tape level across the back.
Underbust	Directly beneath the bust, snug against the ribcage.
Waist	The narrowest part of the torso, usually just above the navel.
Hips	Around the fullest part of the seat, roughly 20 cm below the waist.
Shoulder to shoulder	Across the back, from one shoulder point to the other.
Shoulder to bust point	From the shoulder seam down to the apex of the bust.
Shoulder to waist (front)	From the shoulder seam over the bust to the natural waist.
Nape to waist (back)	From the base of the neck down the spine to the waist.
Arm length	From the shoulder point to the wrist, arm slightly bent.
Bicep	Around the fullest part of the upper arm.
Wrist	Around the wrist bone.
Waist to hem	From the natural waist to the desired finished length, in your shoes.
Height	Barefoot, standing against a wall.
Heel height	Height of the shoes to be worn with the dress.
